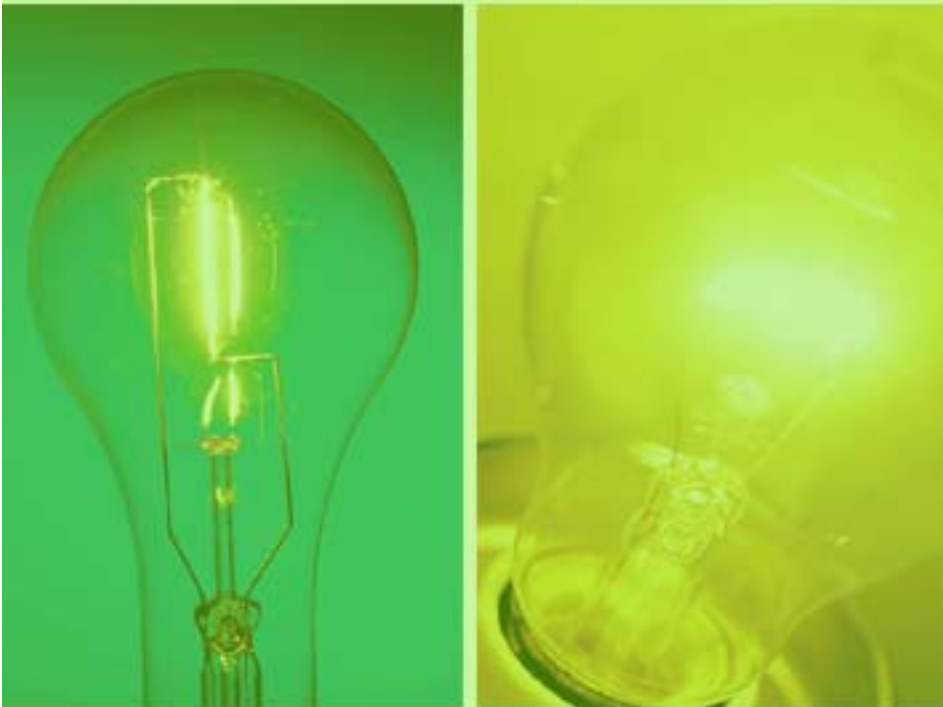

Pass the Problem

- Divide into 5 groups.
- Brainstorm a list of ideas to address the issue you are given and record on the paper provided.
- When you hear the whistle, put your list in the folder and “pass the problem” to the next group.
- When you receive your original folder back, read all responses and share the best two suggestions with the whole group.



Types of Activities

- Learning
 - Guest speaker, panel, team presentation, jigsaw
- Applying knowledge and skills
 - In-basket, role-plays, exercises, games
- Orientations
 - Introduction to ESS, tours, ESS in a BCERMS Environment, kit cleanup, social events, videos
- Reviewing
 - Informal training, games, team presentations
- Promoting reflection and sharing experiences
 - Panel, group discussion, small-group brainstorming



Tabletops for Meetings

- Ensure the purpose is clear
- Set out ground rules for participation
- Stay within the meeting timeframe
- Basic is the best (at least to start)
- Present problems that challenge
- Leave time for evaluation
- Follow up on recommendations
- Have FUN!
