

Personal Items

You have just been told you must evacuate your home and you have 10 minutes to gather your things. Here is a list of suggested items to “grab and go”:

- medications and medical aids
- important documents
 - passports
 - birth certificates
 - immigration documents
 - insurance documents
- eye glasses, contact lens (lens solution etc)
- purse, wallet, credit cards, money
- phone numbers for family and friends
- toiletries
- items for children
 - special toys
 - diapers
 - water, snacks/bottles
- cell phone and charger
- car keys, house keys and other needed keys
- clothing (enough clothing for each day you will be out of your home)
- day-timer/appointment calendar
- pet items (leash, food, dishes, litter pan, carrier, toys, treats etc)
- items needed for work
 - clothing
 - briefcase
 - tools
 - identification

Shopping for Incidentals

After you have been evacuated from your home there are many items that you could not bring with you. Here is a list of suggested essential items for you to purchase:

- deodorant
- shampoo/conditioner or other hair products
- toothbrush and toothpaste
- razor and shaving cream
- makeup
- batteries
- pen/paper (children's school supplies)
- bottles
- wipes
- non-prescription medications
- feminine hygiene products
- laundry supplies
- pet food

Shopping for Clothing

After being evacuated from your home you may not think of all the items you may need for the next several days. Here is a list of suggested clothing items to purchase:

- underwear
- socks
- bras
- shirts, sweaters (warm ones if the weather is cool)
- pants
- shoes
- work attire, if necessary
- baby diapers
